

REMEMBERING the Fallen. . . HONORING those who Serve. . . TEACHING our children the value of Freedom.

On Saturday, December 14, 2019, Assembly 3309 of Rio Rancho, New Mexico in conjunction Daniels Funeral Home, Vista Verde Memorial Park, Rio Rancho, NM participated in Wreaths Across America to Remember and Honor our veterans through the laying of Remembrance Wreaths on the graves of our country's Fallen Heroes and the act of saying the name of each and every Veteran aloud.

In attendance were local VFW Post 5890, American Legion Post 118, the Legion Riders, the Marine Corps JROTC from Rio Rancho, the Army JROTC from Cleveland High School, the Boy Scouts of America Troop 2010, Church of the Incarnation, Troop 702, San Isidro, Vice Supreme Master Richard Espinosa, keynote speaker Deacon Norbert Archibeque, Col(R) US Army and WWII Veteran Mr. Joe Ryan, US Army Air Corp. B-25 Crew Member.

In addition to remembering and honoring the veterans that are interred here at this cemetery and other cemeteries during this Wreaths Across America memorial, let us also remember the members of our armed forces who never made it home and whose resting place is known only to God.

I'd like to share the story of one man who once went from being known to unknown to known again. Michael J Blassie was born in St. Louis in 1948 and was a classmate of my wife when they together attended Our Lady of Perpetual Help school in the early 1960's. Following graduation from High School, Michael graduated from the United States Air Force Academy in 1970. He then was assigned to the 8th Special Operations Squadron of the 377th Air Base Wing and sent to Bien Hoa Air Base near Saigon.

On May 11, 1972, 24 year old, 1st Lt. Michael Blassie was on his 138th combat mission in the vicinity of An Loc when he was shot by anti-aircraft fire and his plane rolled, turned upside down, crashed and exploded. Initial recovery attempts were launched but failed due to control of the area by enemy forces. With no evidence that Michael had survived, he was classed "Killed in Action, Body not Recovered". Five months later in October 1972, a South Vietnamese patrol reached the crash site. Human remains were found and recovered along with personal items that were identified as belonging to Michael. The remains and personal items were turned over to US Army Central Identification Laboratory in Hawaii. As there had been other aircraft that had gone done in the same area, the lab did not conclusively identify the remains as being those of Michael Blassie and were then designated as "Unknown" with the id of "X-26".

Twelve years later, in 1984, "X-26" was designated the "Unknown" service member from the Vietnam War and was interred at Arlington National Cemetery on Memorial Day.

Ten years later in 1994, evidence was discovered by a researcher that indicated that the Vietnam Unknown was in fact Michael J Blassie. In January 1998, CBS News finally picked up on the story. Once the story broke that the unknown may be known, my wife contacted the Blassie family and joined them in contacting officials in Washington DC to have the remains exhumed and DNA testing performed to determine whether the Vietnam unknown was indeed Michael Blassie. On May 14, 1998, 26 years after Michael's plane was shot down, the remains were exhumed and DNA testing proved the identity of the remains were that of Michael's.

Michael Blassie was returned to his family and reinterred at Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery in St. Louis on July 11, 1998. He was 24 years old when he died and returned to his family when he would have been 50 years old. I personally never knew Michael but I feel as though I know him through the stories my wife shared of the memories of him when they were growing up together in St. Louis. His memory can also remind us of those who never had the chance to be reunited with their families. The tomb for the Vietnam Unknown remains empty to this day and the marker has been replaced with one that reads "Honoring and Keeping Faith with America's Missing Servicemen". As of the end of 2018, the number of U.S. military and civilian personnel still unaccounted for from the Vietnam War stands at 1,592.

Second Annual Saint Joseph's Table March 21, 2020 Italian American Club, Rio Rancho



We need to get a firm commitment of those member Knights that are willing to cook an Italian dish to help serve the Parish.

Based on the success of last year's event, Fr. Leo has asked that the Knights open the event up to the parish community. Because of the limit of about 300 people set by the fire department for the Italian-American Club we have targeted to prepare about 300 meals.

The most critical step in our preparation now is to get a firm commitment from Knights and their families to do the cooking and service the event.

This is a very important event for our Council for several reasons. The money raised will be given to the State's U ultrasound fund to support various Pro-Life initiatives. As an organization we constantly ask the parishioners for money and this event will be an opportunity to give something back to them. It will provide a venue for community building in the Church. And, most importantly, it will be a way to honor and pray to St. Joseph.

If we can get a commitment from 30 Knights and their families to do the cooking, then the amount of food that each family would need to prepare would be to feed 10. Forty Knights doing the cooking and the amount to cook drops to feeding only 7-8.

We will also need Knights to form several committees and take the lead for certain aspects of the event. These committees include: Food, decorations, service and publicity.

Did You Know?

A Yuletide story of the Knights of Columbus Founder

It was an especially joyous occasion for Father Michael McGivney when he entered his boyhood church for Christmas celebrations in 1877. He was 25 years old, newly ordained, and ready to offer his first Solemn Mass before family members and friends at Immaculate Conception Church in his hometown of Waterbury, Conn. The popular young man, known for his winning manner and personal piety, was among his own people of Irish immigrants, including his mother, and first-generation Irish-Americans like himself and his siblings. Along with the joy of the event, there must have been a few nervous moments for the new priest as he celebrated for the first time the refined and elaborate rites of the solemn Latin Mass.

Though he was confident of his vocation, the path to the priesthood was far from simple for young McGivney. As the eldest of 13 children, he followed his father into factory life after completing school at age 13, working two years for a spoon manufacturer. The local pastor, however, encouraged him to consider the priesthood, and in 1868 young Michael took a train with a handful of other Waterbury teens to Quebec to begin studies at the College of St. Hyacinthe. It was his first time out of the country, but he felt at home with the idea of the priesthood. He continued his formation with the study of the classics at Niagara University's Our Lady of Angels Seminary, where he played for the school's Charter Oaks baseball team. In the fall of 1872, he returned to Canada to begin philosophy studies at St. Mary's College Seminary in Montreal.


But when Michael went home to Waterbury for the sad occasion of his father's funeral in June 1873, his plans for priesthood were as unclear as his family's finances. However, seeing the great potential in young McGivney, Hartford's Bishop Francis McFarland provided a scholarship for him to study theology for four years at St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, where he excelled. Michael J. McGivney was ordained Dec. 22, 1877, in the Baltimore cathedral by Archbishop James Gibbons, who later became a cardinal. After ordination, Father McGivney embarked on the long trip to Waterbury, in central Connecticut, to offer his first solemn Mass – a hometown boy who made good in a growing American Church.

In the new year, he would begin his ministry as a parish priest at St. Mary's in New Haven, where he befriended a band of resourceful, energetic Irishmen and made plans for the formation of the Knights of Columbus. Today, he is a candidate for sainthood with his cause active at the Vatican.
