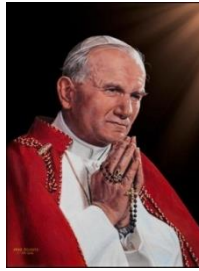

The apex of my gratitude is for the gift of Christ's birth and God's coming to dwell among us.

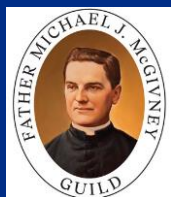

Know of my prayers for you and your loved ones this Christmas and in the year to come. And please know of my gratitude.

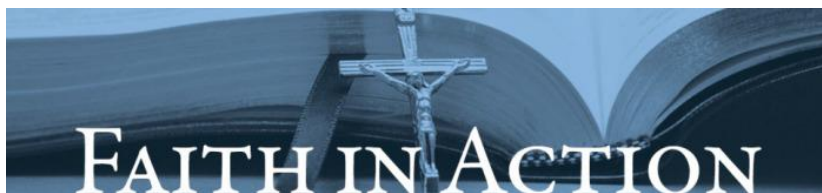

SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

Jesus rebuked him and said, “Quiet! Come out of him!” The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, “What is this?

A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him.” (Gospel for Jan. 28, Mk 1:25-27)

The unclean spirit immediately recognizes Jesus as the Christ and is aware of his power. As St.

James tells us, “You believe that God is one. You do well. Even the demons believe that and tremble” (Jas 2:19). We must not take for granted who Jesus is, his presence in our midst and the power he has to help us. Let us always recognize that Jesus is actively working in our lives and seek him daily in our prayer.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to attend Mass and receive holy Communion more often than just on Sunday — daily if possible — to grow in awareness of Jesus’ presence and power in the Eucharist.

The Importance of Community and Corporate Communion

In his homily for the Saturday Mass, Dec 2, Fr. Leo discussed the importance of the Mass, the importance of celebrating the Mass as a community of Catholic believers. This is where we come together to share with Jesus our love of God, our Church, and just as important, each other.

Practically from the beginning of time it seems, people have come together to celebrate their religious beliefs in a community of like-minded other people. Much of our traditions in celebrating the Mass came from the Jewish traditions of prayer in the Synagogue which goes back centuries.

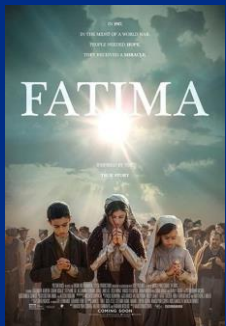
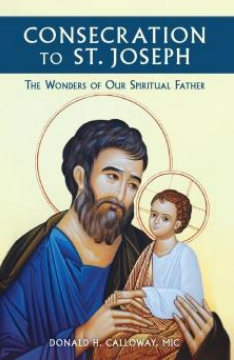
That this sense of community survives all through the ages tells us our need for community is hard wired into our very DNA, just as we are wired for God in our DNA. And it tells us our need for community will last all through the ages to come. As bad as the virus Covid 19 has been to many of us, the disastrous social experiment that came with it, that sought to separate us and make us fearful of each other, has not dampened our basic *need* for community.

Community gives us strength, helps to better understand our purpose, which is to find our way back to God. It calms our souls and moves us closer to God. Community, in a sense, is our formation as Christians. It's where we learn, it's where we hear the word of God, and it's where we better understand the meaning of that word; and we do it together. As it always has been in our faith, so it is with the Knights of Columbus. Community is what the Knights are, who we are, why we are. Our core values, charity, unity, fraternity, and in the Fourth Degree, patriotism, define us as a community. This plays out when we participate in our activities. It plays out when we attend our meetings. It plays out when we come together to worship the Mass at corporate communion as a community of brother knights and our families.

It is true to say that the things we do as Knights are important things, to be sure, but one of the most important is Corporate Communion. Its importance lies in we as Knights coming together every fifth Sunday, and especially during the Easter season, to participate in the sacrifice of the Eucharist at Mass, the Mass, the Mass.

I guess what I'm trying to get at is this; there is a special shared sense of purpose in our core values as a community of Knights when we share the worship of the Mass together. The Eucharist shared at Mass is the cornerstone of the foundation of the Knights of Columbus, even before our core values.

And so, my brothers, that's the importance of Corporate Communion to the Knights. Let's get back to celebrating the Eucharist together at Corporate Communion again.

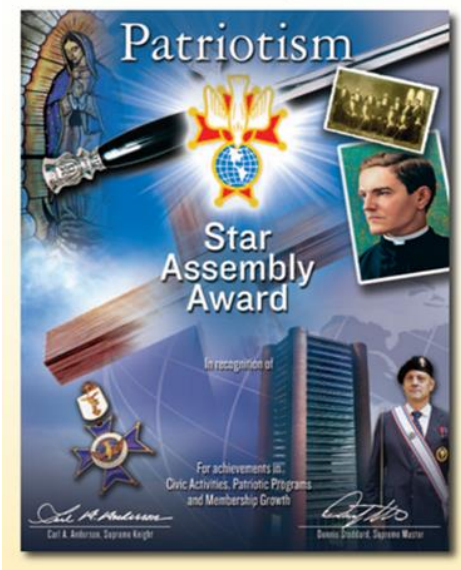
STAR COUNCIL

GUIDELINES FOR POLITICAL ACTIVITY

Knights are first and foremost Catholic citizens who are members of their communities and constituents of their elected officials. A citizen most effectively petitions his elected official as an individual voter. Ordinarily, there is no need to refer to one's membership in the Knights of Columbus when petitioning an elected official. The message we want to send is "I am an informed constituent who has a principled stand [against/in favor of] your public policy choices and I vote." As Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI reminded us. "It is imperative that the entire Catholic community in the United States comes to realize the grave threats to the Church's public moral witness." [1] To help members answer this call to faithful citizenship effectively, the Knights of Columbus provides the following list of political activity "DOs and DON'Ts":

DOs	DON'TS
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DO become active in the political life of your local community. • DO register to vote and encourage others to register to vote; • DO initiate and participate in robust "get out the vote" efforts to bring voters to the polls in all primary, general, and special elections. • DO become informed on public policy issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church at the local, state, federal, and international levels. • DO become acquainted with public policy initiatives of the national conferences of Catholic Bishops as well as state and provincial Catholic conferences. • DO study and reflect upon the teachings of the Catholic Church so as to develop a well-formed Catholic conscience - a good place to start would be to review relevant sections of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, available at http://www.vatican.va/archive/ENG0015/_INDEX.HTM • DO order booklets on specific issues of fundamental importance to Catholics published by the Catholic Information Service, http://www.kofc.org/un/en/cis/index.html • DO share with others the Catholic Church's teachings on moral issues of fundamental importance to society. • DO advocate for Catholic positions on local and national legislative and other issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church. This includes participation in action alert announcements that seek to make the voices of Catholic citizens heard on legislation of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church. • DO write letters to the editor of local newspapers. • DO know your elected representatives and their positions on issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church; a. • DO correspond with your representatives and let them know that you support the Catholic position on issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church; • DO thank representatives for their actions taken on issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church;. • DO join the Supreme Council and your State Council in advocating for public policy issues. When doing so, echo the sentiments and wording the Supreme Council or your State Council have already articulated, and. • DO VOTE! 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DO NOT engage in any partisan political activity in the name of the Knights of Columbus. Partisan political activity is defined as including activity that seeks to endorse or oppose a candidate or party in a campaign for public office. • DO NOT make partisan political statements in the name of the Knights of Columbus. A partisan political statement is defined as including statements that seek to endorse or oppose a candidate or party in a campaign for public office. • DO NOT, on behalf of your local council, congratulate or admonish public officials in the name of the Knights of Columbus. • DO NOT, on behalf of your local council, take a position on a matter of public policy unless you are joining a position the Supreme Council, or your State Council has already articulated. • DO NOT distribute any Knights of Columbus member lists or contact information to political campaigns or to individuals running for office. • DO NOT use an official fraternal title in connection with your personal political activity, except to convey biographical information; and • DO NOT use Knights of Columbus facilities, including, but not limited to, email accounts, social media, fax machines, letterhead, and the like, in connection with partisan political activity. <p>At no time will the Knights of Columbus act as a security.</p>

Knights of Columbus Unified Participation in the National Eucharistic Revival

*The Eucharist is the source and summit in the life of a Knight.
The more we devote ourselves to the Eucharist,

The Bishops of the United States have invited all US Catholics to return to the source and summit of our faith in the celebration of the Eucharist. As Knights, we should respond to this call for a National Eucharistic Revival, which "...is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery... by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist" (eucharisticrevival.org).

We encourage all Knights to find ways to participate in this revival – individually, as a local council, and at the state level.

Below are some of our recommendations for this year as we prepare for the National Eucharistic Congress.

INDIVIDUAL KNIGHTS

- † **Sacrifice for Our Lord and the Revival:** Abstain from meat on Fridays as a form of penance, prayer and devotion.
- † **Pray with Our Lady:** Pray the Rosary the 12th of each month (in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe 12/12 and Blessed McGivney's birthday 8/12) for the success of the Revival and an increase in devotion to Christ in the Eucharist.
- † **Prepare your heart:** Arrive 10-15 minutes early to each Mass to contemplate Jesus' gift of himself.
- † **Give thanks:** Offer 5 minutes of prayerful praise after each Mass and pray the Anima Christi.
- † **Be with Our Lord:** Spend 30 extra minutes every week outside of Mass sitting or kneeling before the Blessed Sacrament.
- † **Attend Daily Mass:** On days you cannot, make an act of Spiritual Communion.
- † **Pray for the gift of the Spirit during the National Eucharistic Procession:** Starting May 10, 2024, pray the Novena to Holy Spirit in preparation for Pentecost and start of National Eucharistic Procession (May 17th) Learn more about the National Eucharistic Procession at www.eucharisticpilgrimage.org.
- † **Unite with fellow Catholics:** Register for the National Eucharistic Congress and encourage others to join you! (July 17 – 21, 2024, Indianapolis, Indiana.) Knights of Columbus members are eligible for a discounted registration by visiting www.eucharisticcongress.org and using the discount code: **knights**.

LOCAL COUNCILS

- † **Pray together:** Each month, invite members to pray the Rosary together on the 12th for the success of the Revival and an increase in devotion to Christ in the Eucharist.
- † **Adore and reconcile with Our Lord:** Organize the Holy Hour Program with the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- † **Encourage parish participation:** Share the Knights of Columbus Eucharistic Revival & Eucharistic Procession materials with your pastor/chaplain and offer to assist him in promoting Adoration and coordinating a Eucharistic Procession (www.kofc.org/eucharist).
- † **Unite at the Congress:** Talk to your pastor to see if your parish will be represented at the National Eucharistic Congress. Register as a group from your parish/council for the National Eucharistic Congress (July 17 – 21, 2024, Indianapolis, Indiana). Knights of Columbus members are eligible for a discounted registration by visiting www.eucharisticcongress.org and using the discount code: **knights**.
- † **Revival in your Council Meeting:** Invite your council lecturer or another speaker to present on topics related to the Eucharist.

STATE COUNCILS

- † **Promote fraternal prayer:** Send monthly reminders to pray the Rosary together on the 12th for the success of the Revival and an increase in devotion to Christ in the Eucharist.
- † **Provide encouragement:** State deputies could encourage participation in the Holy Hour program by local councils.
- † **Organize diocesan or statewide devotion:** Request, plan, and manage a diocesan or statewide Eucharistic Procession. Invite all Catholics through councils, parishes, and, when possible, diocesan offices. For Eucharistic Procession guides and resources visit kofc.org/eucharist
- † **Bring the Eucharist to the Nation:** Participate in the National Eucharistic Procession by:
 - Learning more about the National Eucharistic Procession and explore resources on www.eucharisticpilgrimage.org.
 - Partner with General Agents to offer assistance to dioceses as the Eucharist crosses through your state.
 - Provide maps and information about the Eucharistic Procession to local councils.
- † **Foster fraternity:** Encourage a group from each council to register for the National Eucharistic Congress (July 17 – 21, 2024, Indianapolis, Indiana). Knights of Columbus members are eligible for a discounted registration by visiting www.eucharisticcongress.org and using the discount code: **knights**.

Social Media Communications (part-time) includes managing and promoting social media accounts in cooperation with our marketing strategy goals.

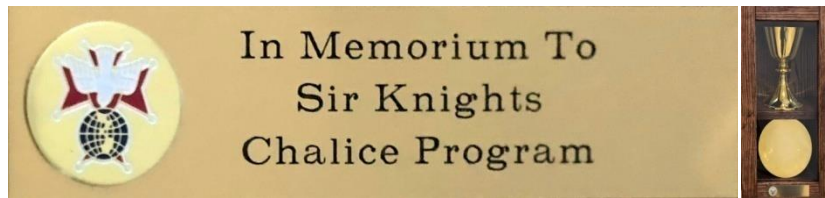
