

Shalom of God vs. Marxist Socialism

As many of you did, either in an earlier e-mail from Ron K and Tom, or from the Council newsletter two months ago, I watched Fr. Carney's talk in Los Alamos. I haven't known Fr. John as long or as well as some have, but for as long as I've known him, I have always considered him to be a sound, solid, and in some important ways, a Holy man, with a firm conviction in Jesus and a clear understanding of the condition of the Church, the institution of the Church, and our society.

As you heard, he doesn't agree with some of the things the Pope and our Archbishop have said and done, or not said and not done. I have always believed, as he does, that it is our responsibility to disagree, respectfully, with people of authority in the Church when it is clear that their position is wrong-minded.

In fact, we, the laity of the Church are called to do exactly that by Vatican II:

"By reason of the knowledge, competence or pre-eminence which they have, the laity are empowered—indeed sometimes obliged—to manifest their opinion on those things which pertain to the good of the Church". (Lumen Gentium, Paragraph 37).

But for us as practicing Catholics to hold those positions, we must first have a firm understanding of the beliefs of the Church. We get that from the writings of the Fathers, the Doctors and Saints of the Church, from the traditions of the Church going back to the time of Jesus. We get that from the Bible, Old and New Testaments, from the Psalms and Gospels, from our participation in the Church, Mass and reconciliation, and from reading books about the Church. One of the books I would suggest is the writings of Vatican II – not what some para-council partisans write about the "spirit" of the council, but the actual written words of the council itself. It should be said here, the Catechism of the Catholic Church currently in use today, that clearly lays out in no uncertain terms, the teachings of the Church, was born from the writings of Vatican II.

It was interesting Fr. John answered the question about what others think of us as Catholics by making the point that we often don't do our own research of the Church. We, the people of the Church, have not done a good job of evangelizing the Church to others, *or to ourselves*.

Over the last few years this is exactly what I have been doing, asking questions and researching the answers. Allowing one answer to ask 5 more questions, and finding answers for them, and on and on. And most of all, coming to understand the beauty of the Scriptures when taken in the context of the rich traditions of the Church.

But Fr. Carney mentioned something else that caught my attention, and he elaborated on it a little:

The Shalom of God.

Shalom is: wholeness, completeness, health, safety, harmony, and prosperity; that there's a sense of eternal permanence in this. The Shalom of God is all this, that lives deep in our very core, that deeply believes in, and comes from God.

I believe one of the most important things that must be done for us to come to the Shalom of God is to evangelize ourselves in the richness of Mother Church.

Not to be the pessimist in this, but when Fr. John was talking, I thought of Carl Marx. A basic understanding of Marx reveals his deep hatred of society in general, and the Catholic Church in particular. It reveals his belief, and the belief of his followers, that a society that believes in God must be destroyed and replaced with the god that is the state. In an open republic this takes the form of an erosion of freedoms done slowly enough over a period of years that most don't recognize what has happened until they are faced with the reality that the things, they took for granted are gone, or severely reduced.

Over the last 70 or more years we have seen the slow removal of God in our society, removal of prayer in our schools, in public gatherings, and the removal of God in the Pledge of Allegiance. This has born the beginning of a different, cold, society that tells us that good is bad, and bad is good, that is changing our education system from within in the education our children, that has allowed, and more recently encouraged, the destruction of human life in the womb, and attempts to replace God with the state that will "take care of everything for us".


History tells us this never ends well - but so few know their history.

I thought of Marx when Fr. was talking because it struck me:

The Shalom of God is the greater opposing force of Marxist Socialism, and it is also true that The Shalom of God, the true peace of the love of God felt deep in our very core, is what Marxist Socialism fears the most because that cannot be taken from you. "Fear not the man who can take your life, for he can take nothing more", (Lk 12:4.) It's important to know who our enemy is, what we're facing now, and how we got here. Fr. Johns comments about the Shalom of God was the first time I had ever heard of this; but somehow, in a way I can't quite explain, it gives me hope.





SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

"But I say to you, do not swear at all Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the evil one." (Gospel for Feb. 12, Mt 5:34a, 37)

Jesus here decries casual oaths that offend God, but all sorts of deceitful, blasphemous or obscene language is frequently heard in our society today. Taking the Lord's name in vain — or misusing our gift of speech in other ways — has become commonplace. Showing respect for God is fundamental to the Christian life and doing so in our speech is a pivotal place to start. Let's speak plainly and keep our speech pure and true to honor God.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to mindfully practice curbing your tongue, particularly avoiding taking the Lord's name in vain. Second, I challenge you to seek to grow in your respect for God as a Catholic man by participating in the Faith in Action Into the Breach program.

Questions for Reflection:

Do you pay much attention to what you say and how you say it? Do you notice what you hear around you, whether from the people in your life or from media you consume? What are some specific ways you can try to avoid speech that fails to show respect for God?




