



Safe Port in a Storm

"The best people possess a feeling for beauty, the courage to take risks, the discipline to tell the truth, the capacity for sacrifice. Ironically, their virtues make them vulnerable; they are often wounded, sometimes destroyed." ERNEST HEMINGWAY

This quote came across in my e-mail this past weekend and I thought it appropriate for the times we're living in now, when good people are sought out for destruction by the ever-increasing forces of socialist evil.

This evil seeks not only to destroy good people, but seeks to destroy our society as a whole. This evil seeks to replace God with the state, to destroy God. This evil knows that one of the strongest places God lives is in the hearts and minds of the traditional family, and so, to destroy God it must destroy the traditional family. You ever wonder why it is so easy to destroy a child in abortion, but so very difficult to adopt a child?

To push back against this evil is to risk persecution in the courts of the media, to risk losing everything, to be "canceled". But still, good people push back, whatever the cost. And finally, it looks as if there is light ahead, that pushing back is starting to make a difference.

In his homily on the family for the feast of the Holy Family, Fr. Leo, in my opinion, absolutely nailed it, knocked it out of the park. He spoke of the importance of parents who provide their children with a loving environment, who provide instruction, guidance, discipline when needed, and a loving example of fathers and mothers who not only love each other, but are *in* love with each other. By doing so, they set the course for their children to carry on their example and create other loving families.


This is one of the reasons the Church will never celebrate same sex marriages. Same sex marriages do not bring new children into the world, and by not doing so, destroys the traditional family. It now becomes clear why the forces of evil are so determined to encourage, not just same sex marriages, but all the other "alternative life styles" that move us further away from the love of God that lives in the family.

Fr. McGivney's desire to support families of Catholic men in need was the very basis for the Knights of Columbus. We as knights stand to oppose the evil that destroys family. As knights we have always, do now, and always will provide a safe port in the storm for our families on rough seas.



FEBRUARY 2024 SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; then from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." (Gospel for Feb. 25, Mk 9:7)

In last month's challenge, we talked about recognizing Jesus' presence and power in our lives. Here, at his baptism, we hear the voice of God instructing us very simply: "Listen to him." It is not enough to acknowledge Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God. We must also be attentive to his teachings — communicated through sacred Scripture and sacred tradition — and respond by following him faithfully. This is the path of the true disciple who understands his own baptismal mission. May we follow this path faithfully throughout our lives.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to spend at least 10 minutes each day in prayerful silence, contemplating the presence of Jesus and listening for his voice.

Questions for Reflection:

How do you listen for the voice of Jesus? What steps can you take in your prayer life, your spiritual reading, your pious practices and your religious study to hear his voice more clearly? What dispositions and virtues should you foster within yourself in order to become more open and responsive to what Christ is telling you?

Lord, make me an instrument of Your Peace: Where there is hatred, let me sow love; Where there is injury, pardon; Where there is doubt, faith; Where there is despair, hope; Where there is darkness, light; And where there is sadness, joy.

O Divine Master, Grant that I may not so much seek To be consoled as to console; To be understood, as to understand; To be loved, as to love;

For it is in giving that we receive, It is in pardoning that we are pardoned,







GUIDELINES FOR POLITICAL ACTIVITY

Knights are first and foremost Catholic citizens who are members of their communities and constituents of their elected officials. A citizen most effectively petitions his elected official as an individual voter. Ordinarily, there is no need to refer to one's membership in the Knights of Columbus when petitioning an elected official. The message we want to send is "1 am an informed constituent who has a principled stand [against/in favor of] your public policy choices and I vote." As Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI reminded us. "It is imperative that the entire Catholic community in the United States comes to realize the grave threats to the Church's public moral witness."[1] To help members answer this call to faithful citizenship effectively, the Knights of Columbus provides the following list of political activity "DOs and DON'Ts":

DOs

- DO become active in the political life of your local community.
- DO register to vote and encourage others to register to vote;
- DO initiate and participate in robust "get out the vote" efforts to bring voters to the polls in all primary, general, and special elections.
- DO become informed on public policy issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church at the local, state, federal, and international levels.
- DO become acquainted with public policy initiatives of the national conferences of Catholic Bishops as well as state and provincial Catholic conferences.
- DO study and reflect upon the teachings of the Catholic Church so as to develop a well-formed Catholic conscience - a good place to start would be to review relevant sections of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, available at <u>http://www.vatican.va/archive/ENG0015/_INDEX.HTM</u>
- DO order booklets on specific issues of fundamental importance to Catholics published by the Catholic information Service, <u>http://www.kofc.org/un/en/cis/index.html</u>
- DO share with others the Catholic Church's teachings on moral issues of fundamental importance to society.
- DO advocate for Catholic positions on local and national legislative and other issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church. This includes participation in action alert announcements that seek to make the voices of Catholic citizens heard on legislation of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church.
- DO write letters to the editor of local newspapers.
- DO know your elected representatives and their positions on issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church; a.
- DO correspond with your representatives and let them know that you support the Catholic position on issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church;
- DO thank representatives for their actions taken on issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church;.
- DO join the Supreme Council and your State Council in advocating for public policy issues. When doing so, echo the sentiments and wording the Supreme Council or your State Council have already articulated, and.
- DO VOTE!

DON'TS

- DO NOT engage in any partisan political activity in the name of the Knights of Columbus. Partisan political activity is defined as including activity that seeks to endorse or oppose a candidate or party in a campaign for public office.
- DO NOT make partisan political statements in the name of the Knights of Columbus. A partisan political statement is defined as including statements that seek to endorse or oppose a candidate or party in a campaign for public office.
- DO NOT, on behalf of your local council, congratulate or admonish public officials in the name of the Knights of Columbus.
- DO NOT, on behalf of your local council, take a position on a matter of public policy unless you are joining a position the Supreme Council, or your State Council has already articulated.
- DO NOT distribute any Knights of Columbus member lists or contact information to political campaigns or to individuals running for office.
- DO NOT use an official fraternal title in connection with your personal political activity, except to convey biographical information; and
- D0 NOT use Knights of Columbus facilities, including, but not limited to, email accounts, social media, fax machines, letterhead, and the like, in connection with partisan political activity.

At no time will the Knights of Columbus act as a security.

Knights of Columbus Unified Participation in the National Eucharistic Revival

The Eucharist is the source and summit in the life of a Knight. The more we devote ourselves to the Eucharist, the more we will understand what it means to be a Knight.

The Bishops of the United States have invited all US Catholics to return to the source and summit of our faith in the celebration of the Eucharist. As Knights, we should respond to this call for a National Eucharistic Revival, which "...is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery... by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist" (eucharisticrevival.org).

We encourage all Knights to find ways to participate in this revival – individually, as a local council, and at the state level.

Below are some of our recommendations for this year as we prepare for the National Eucharistic Congress.

INDIVIDUAL KNIGHTS

- * Sacrifice for Our Lord and the Revival: Abstain from meat on Fridays as a form of penance, prayer and devotion.
- Pray with Our Lady: Pray the Rosary the 12th of each month (in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe 12/12 and Blessed McGivney's birthday 8/12) for the success of the Revival and an increase in devotion to Christ in the Eucharist.
- * Prepare your heart: Arrive 10-15 minutes early to each Mass to contemplate Jesus' gift of himself.
- † Give thanks: Offer 5 minutes of prayerful praise after each Mass and pray the Anima Christi.
- * Be with Our Lord: Spend 30 extra minutes every week outside of Mass sitting or kneeling before the Blessed Sacrament.
- † Attend Daily Mass: On days you cannot, make an act of Spiritual Communion.
- Pray for the gift of the Spirit during the National Eucharistic Procession: Starting May 10, 2024, pray the Novena to Holy Spirit in preparation for Pentecost and start of National Eucharistic Procession (May 17th) Learn more about the National Eucharistic Procession at www.eucharisticpilgrimage.org.
- Inite with fellow Catholics: Register for the National Eucharistic Congress and encourage others to join you! (July 17 – 21, 2024, Indianapolis, Indiana.) Knights of Columbus members are eligible for a discounted registration by visiting www.eucharisticcongress.org and using the discount code: knights.

LOCAL COUNCILS

- Pray together: Each month, invite members to pray the Rosary together on the 12th for the success of the Revival and an increase in devotion to Christ in the Eucharist.
- Adore and reconcile with Our Lord: Organize the Holy Hour Program with the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- * Encourage parish participation: Share the Knights of Columbus Eucharistic Revival & Eucharistic Procession materials with your pastor/chaplain and offer to assist him in promoting Adoration and coordinating a Eucharistic Procession (www.kofc.org/eucharist).
- Unite at the Congress: Talk to your pastor to see if your parish will be represented at the National Eucharistic Congress. Register as a group from your parish/council for the National Eucharistic Congress (July 17 – 21, 2024, Indianapolis, Indiana). Knights of Columbus members are eligible for a discounted registration by visiting www.eucharisticcongress.org and using the discount code: knights.
- Revival in your Council Meeting: Invite your council lecturer or another speaker to present on topics related to the Eucharist.

STATE COUNCILS

- Promote fraternal prayer: Send monthly reminders to pray the Rosary together on the 12th for the success of the Revival and an increase in devotion to Christ in the Eucharist.
- Provide encouragement: State deputies could encourage participation in the Holy Hour program by local councils.
- Organize diocesan or statewide devotion: Request, plan, and manage a diocesan or statewide Eucharistic Procession. Invite all Catholics through councils, parishes, and, when possible, diocesan offices. For Eucharistic Procession guides and resources visit kofc.org/eucharist
- Bring the Eucharist to the Nation: Participate in the National Eucharistic Procession by:
 - Learning more about the National Eucharistic Procession and explore resources on www.eucharisticpilgrimage.org.
 - Partner with General Agents to offer assistance to dioceses as the Eucharist crosses through your state.
 - · Provide maps and information about the Eucharistic Procession to local councils.
- Foster fraternity: Encourage a group from each council to register for the National Eucharistic Congress (July 17 – 21, 2024, Indianapolis, Indiana). Knights of Columbus members are eligible for a discounted registration by visiting www.eucharisticcongress.org and using the discount code: knights.

Dear Brother Knight,

Witness to the sanctity of life! Whether you're participating in the March for Life today in Washington, D.C., or are far from our nation's capital, there is much work to be done.

The good news is, despite what feels like a fraught and polarized environment, there is still a consistent prolife consensus among Americans. <u>A new Knights of Columbus/Marist poll</u> released this week shows that 66% of individuals support placing legal limits on abortion, while 83% of Americans support pregnancy resource centers. Other highlights of the poll include:

• Nearly 6 in 10 Americans support restricting abortions past three months of pregnancy.

• Two-thirds of Americans believe healthcare professionals with religious objections to abortions should not be legally required to perform them.

• 86% of Americans believe laws can protect both the mother and her unborn child.

Still, there are many hearts to be changed and countless mothers who need our support.

Knights of Columbus has long been at the forefront of the pro-life cause. Our Order helped organize the first national March for Life in 1974, and today Knights are among those participating in the 51st annual march. Even if you're not attending in person, you can livestream the March for Life <u>here</u>.

You can also watch the livestream of Life Fest, a pre-March rally sponsored by the Sisters of Life and Knights of Columbus. The rally features dynamic speakers, music, the celebration of Holy Mass and other events that aim to form hearts in receiving every human life as a gift. Join the livestream <u>here</u>.

Building a culture of life is just as important at a local level. Here's how you can engage in the pro-life movement, no matter where you live:

• First and foremost, join us in prayer for the respect of all human life. <u>Download a Rosary for Life prayer</u> card here.

• Work with your council to provide continued support after a baby is born through the <u>Aid and Support</u> <u>after Pregnancy</u> (ASAP) program.

• Participate in a state March for Life near you. To find your nearest march, click here.

• Help expectant mothers see their baby and choose life through the K of C Ultrasound Initiative.

• Provide financial support to the pro-life cause by donating to the <u>Culture of Life Fund</u>, or by opening a donor-advised fund with the <u>Knights of Columbus Charitable Fund</u>, which will help you give year-round to more than 1,500 pro-life organizations in our donor portal.

Confident in the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe, patroness of the Americas, the unborn and our Order, let us make this a year in which we change hearts around the world and support the mothers in need in our communities.

- The new Planned Parenthood at 4630 Eubank Blvd, just north of Montgomery Blvd. Park along the residential side streets of Gutierrez Road and Dona Marguerita Ave. Be careful crossing Eubank Blvd. Pray on the sidewalk along Eubank. Please do not step on Planned Parenthood's property.

- Alamo abortion mill at 10151 Montgomery Blvd NE, just East of Eubank Blvd. Park in the residential area of Del Chaparral Court or by Ernie Taylor Park. Pray on the sidewalk along Montgomery Blvd by the Bear Canyon sign.

- Curtis Boyd's Southwestern Women's Options abortion mill at 522 Lomas Blvd. Park along Woodward Place. The sidewalk counselors, Philip, Christina, and John are there in the mornings.

Your presence on the sidewalk is often the last chance for the child in the womb to be saved. See the **attached 40 Days for Life flyer** for more information and the **schedule below** for the **requested days of prayer** for Albuquerque parishes, churches, and religious organizations ...






