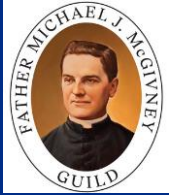

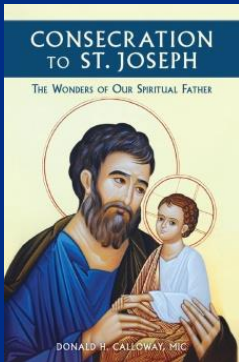

SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

At the sight of the crowds, [Jesus'] heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. (Gospel for June 18, Mt 9:36)

The Gospel read at Mass uses the word “pity,” but other Catholic translations use the word “compassion,” which means “to suffer with.” When we suffer with others, we are naturally moved to comfort them; we are motivated by love to relieve and redress their suffering. In sharing the suffering of the afflicted and aiding them in word and deed, we demonstrate the love of Jesus — and thereby reveal to them the Good Shepherd.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to show compassion and Christian charity for others by serving the poor, the sick, the lonely or those in need in a direct and tangible way. Second, I challenge you to aid in the Faith in Action Global Wheelchair Mission, Habitat for Humanity or Helping Hands program.

Questions for Reflection:

Does the plight of others move you? Do you see suffering and go about your business, or are you moved to provide real assistance? Do you pray for others who are suffering?

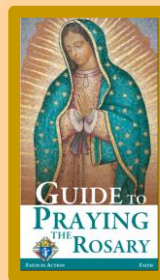

From Worthy Lecturer SK Jimm White

There is a line in *To Kill a Mockingbird* where Atticus is talking to Scout; "You never really understand a person until you consider things from his point of view. Until you climb inside of his skin and walk around in it." Atticus is teaching her perspective. To look at something thru the lens of another person's experience very often gives more meaning to the subject at hand, or a completely different meaning.

I listened with interest to the homily by Fr. Juan Diego at 4 PM Mass a couple of weeks ago. He was talking about the Gospel for that day, the familiar "Road to Emmaus." When Jesus joined two of his disciples, who didn't recognize him, on that road, and asked what they were talking about, they told him of all that had just happened to Jesus. Fr. made the point that they had all the facts, but what they were missing was the meaning. What did it all mean?

Jesus listened to them, then He started to teach. The Gospel tells us Jesus, starting with Moses, and all the prophets, He interpreted to them all the references to Him in the Scriptures.

Then the Gospel tells us at dinner He said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to each of them. This was the Eucharist, and at that moment the disciples recognized Jesus, and they understood the meaning.

Jesus was teaching them, and us today, that all the scriptures lead to, point to, Jesus, and to the Eucharist.

The Eucharist was then, and is now, the meaning.

In The Great Story of Israel, Bishop Barron adds a little perspective to this, and draws from Revelations. In Revelation chapter 5, John describes the scroll, that had writing on both sides and was sealed with 7 seals. Then he saw a mighty angel who proclaimed in a loud voice, "Who is worthy to open the scroll and break it's seals"? The chapter goes on and a few verses later one of the four elders' answers that it is the lamb that looked as if it had been slaughtered holding the scroll.

Chapter 6 begins with the lamb breaking the first seal.

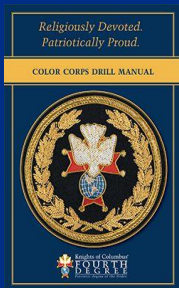
The Lamb of course, is Jesus. Bishop Barron makes the point that the scroll described in Revelation is the Bible, and Jesus, as he did for those disciples, is laying it out for us, teaching us the meaning.

What we are to understand here is that the Bible, the Mass, the Eucharist, and the rest of the Sacraments, has their true meaning, and are only fully understood, when seen thru the lens that is Jesus.

"I am the way and the truth and the life" says the Lord Jesus Christ.

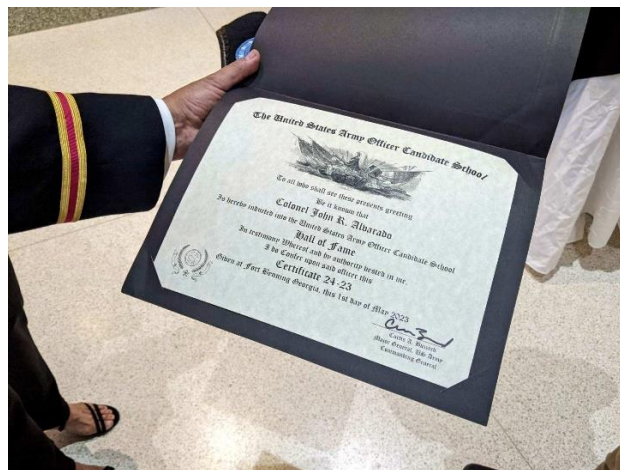

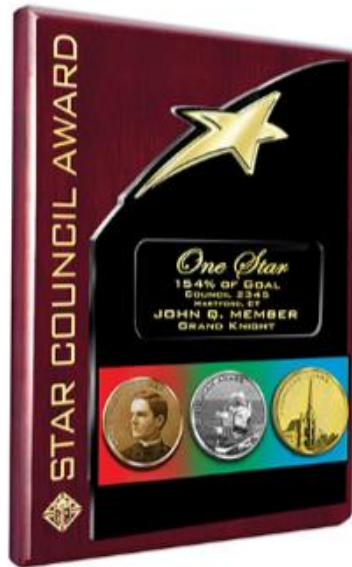

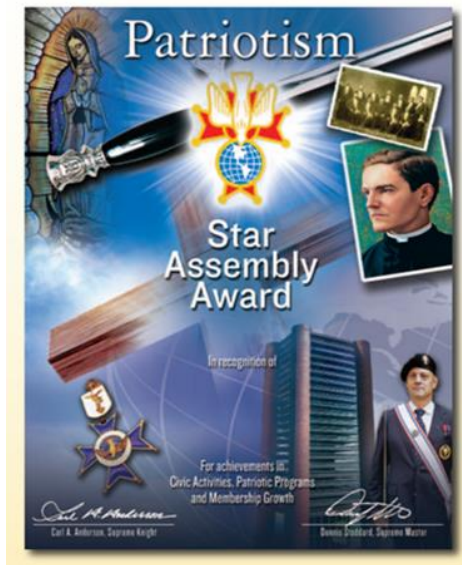
STAR COUNCIL

WANT TO VOLUNTEER?

Social Media Communications (part-time) includes managing and promoting social media accounts in cooperation with our marketing strategy goals.

Pro-Life Outreach Coordinator(s) will assist the President and Development Director with organizing, promoting, and recruiting participants for pro-life events like 40 Days for Life and the Jericho Walk.

Receptionist(s)- Part time will welcome clients as they come to the pregnancy medical clinic, make sure forms are completed, entered, and filed, schedule appointments, and do basic office work. Client Advocacy training will be required and provided by PDL.

Spanish-Speaking Client Advocates (Part-time) will assist clients who are Spanish-speaking in our services, from pregnancy testing, options consultation, to case management. At this time, we are not seeing a high-volume of Spanish-speaking clients and so this will be an on-call position for a designated day and time-frame. We are looking for 10 volunteers to commit to 9-12:30 or 12:30-4 on any given day, Monday through Friday. Client Advocacy training will be required and provided by PDL.

Weekend Cleaners will do basic upkeep of building such as clean bathrooms, sweep and mop floors, and vacuum.

Office Assistance (part-time) will fulfill basic office duties, filing, organizing, product ordering, printing, and mailing.

Event Planning will assist President and Community Outreach director in various tasks for our annual Gala, Galentine's, and other related events.

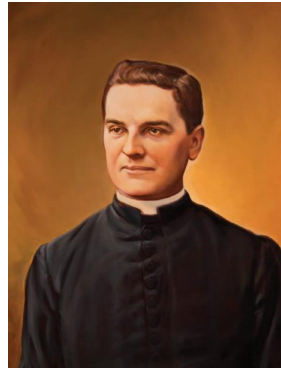

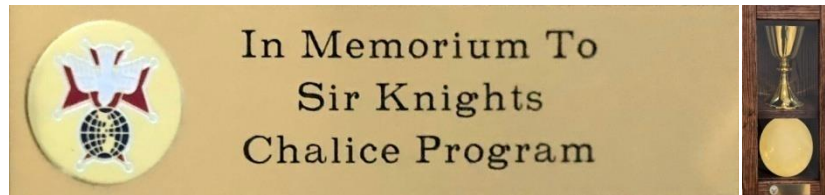
