



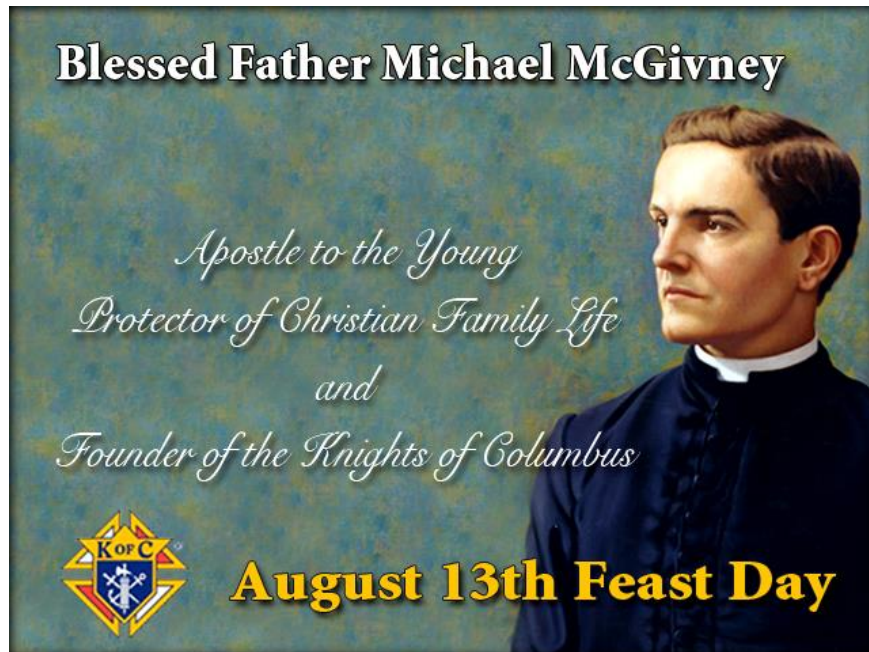

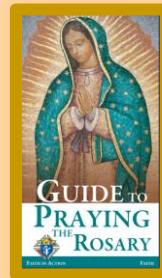

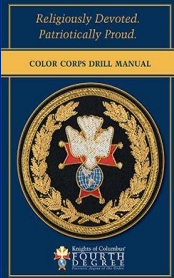

Faith Not Seen

“Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen.
Hebrews 11:1 I recommend you read the whole chapter.

This past May we came out of the liturgical season of Easter, in which we celebrated the crucifixion, the resurrection, the ascension of Jesus Christ, and Pentecost that began the evangelist mission of spreading the Gospel of Jesus and the faith of His Church to the whole world.

In his sermon, given around the time of the celebration of the Ascension, Pope Saint Leo the Great said:

“We are commemorating that day in which our poor human nature was carried up, in Christ, above all the hosts of heaven, above all the ranks of the angels, beyond the highest heavenly powers to the very throne of God the Father. It is upon this ordered structure of divine acts that we have been firmly established.”

“For such is the power of great minds, such the light of truly believing souls, that they put unhesitating faith in what is not seen with bodily eye; they fix their desires on what is beyond sight. Such fidelity could never be born in our hearts, nor could anyone be justified by faith, *if our salvation lay only in what was visible.*”

I was talking with Peggy Meyerson one Sunday after Mass and she said something that was so profound that I realized I had never looked at things with her perspective. She was talking about people who have convinced themselves that they are good people, who have put together a system of belief that they fit into their lives here and now. That reminded me of Sheilism; Sheilism is a shorthand term for an individual's system of religious belief which co-opts strands of multiple religions, some Christian, but mostly others, chosen by the individual usually without much theological consideration; I guess a loose analogy would be cafeteria Catholics. It is the idea that if you consider yourself a good person, that you don't try to hurt anyone, that you do what you think is right, you're ok. Of course, the obvious problem is that no two people have the same vision of what's right, there's no corner stone to judge right and wrong, there's no higher God.

Peggy was saying, “these people are trying to bring God down to their level”. Their faith is in what is visible, what's in front of them. It is a faith that cannot survive. Instead, what we need to do is to raise ourselves up to God, to raise our hearts and prayers to the very Throne of God, as Christ did in the Ascension. Christ had complete trust in His Father, our God, and gave up complete control to Him.

In his reflection on a gospel recently Bishop Barron comments:

“Faith is an attitude of trust in the presence of God. Faith is openness to what God will reveal, do, and invite. It should be obvious that in dealing with the infinite, all-powerful God, we are never in control.”

May Father McGivney intercede for you!

And there's the rub; To raise ourselves up to God we must completely trust in Him, and that requires that we give up control of what's around us, of our arrogant belief that we're OK with where we're at in our lives – because we're not OK if our faith is in what is visible and right in front of us.

Pope Leo continues:

“And so, our Redeemer's visible presence has passed into the sacraments. Our faith is nobler and stronger because sight has been replaced by a doctrine whose authority is accepted by believing hearts, enlightened from on high. This faith was increased by the Lord's ascension and strengthened by the gift of the Spirit; it would remain unshaken by fetters and imprisonment, exile and hunger, fire and ravening beasts, and the most refined tortures ever devised by brutal persecutors. Throughout the world, women no less than men, tender girls and boys, have given their life's blood in the struggle for this faith. It is a faith that has driven out devils, healed the sick and raised the dead.”

This is our faith, that *refuses* that we bring God to our level, our convenience, but *requires* us to surrender ourselves up to God, to the very Throne of God as our Lord Jesus Christ did when He provided our path to His Father.

In 2nd Corinthians, 5:6-10 St. Paul puts it this way:

“We are courageous, although we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, *for we walk by faith, not by sight*. We are courageous, and we would rather leave the body and go home to the Lord. Therefore, we aspire to please him, whether we are at home or away. For we must all appear before the judgement seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil”.

And so, the question is this:

Do we do evil; Attempting to lower God to our level, making us equal to God, to make Him fit, in our own arrogance, into what *we* think works for us in the world in front of us, in the world we can see, in the false hope of the world we put our trust in, that increasingly teaches that good is evil and evil is good, an evil world whose only purpose is to move us further away from the good that is God?

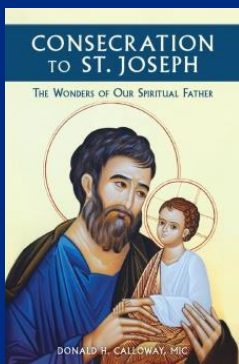
Or do we do good; In our faith do we surrender ourselves up to the throne of God and live our lives for God, in His greater glory, in His service and the service of others, in the true hope of the evidence of things not seen?

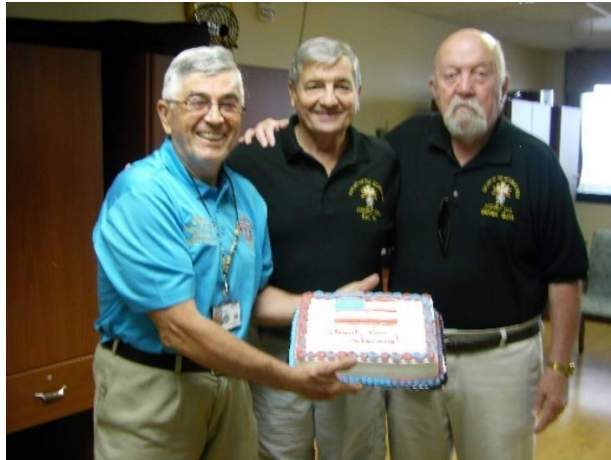

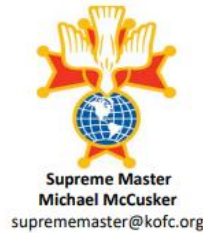

Fourth Degree - Uniform Talk



Worthy Sir Knights & Brothers,

In 2019, the Order entered an agreement with The Supply Room (TSR) in Oxford, Alabama, to serve as the sole manufacturer of the official Fourth Degree uniform. Per the current licensing agreement and the requirements of the Supreme Board of Directors, the manufacturing, production, and sale of the uniform is required to undergo a request for proposal (RFP) every five years.

After reviewing RFPs from TSR and another manufacturer, the Order chose to remain with TSR for an additional three years. Under the new agreement, the cost of the uniform will increase from \$449 to \$475. This new cost will take effect September 1, 2024. The new price is less than the price quoted in the other RFP that the Order received and is below the inflation rate from 2019 to 2024.

Please note that the current TSR pricing is still available through August 31, 2024. Uniforms can be purchased online by visiting kofcuniform.com. I encourage you to avail yourself of that opportunity, especially ahead of the 125th Anniversary of the Fourth Degree on February 22, 2025.

Let's Get Social!

As in social baldrics. Because there's been some changes lately and despite best efforts to communicate these changes, it seems that the message never quite makes it down to the membership or often gets jumbled along the way. So, I am committing this month's Supreme Master's message to explaining the changes in a Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) format. So, here we go!

1. Why did the social baldric go away?

Answer: It has not gone away. Instead, it will no longer be given out to new members at an exemplification.

2. Why was this change made?

Answer: With shipping and handling, the cost of a social baldric eats up approximately 20-25% of the exemplification fee to provide a baldric that will seldom if ever be used again. For one, it does not go with the current uniform, as it was designed for wear with a tuxedo. Two, when it's given to new members completing the degree in a military, law enforcement or firefighter dress uniform, it is not authorized and does not fit with the uniform at all.

3. Who can still wear the social baldric?

Answer: Any member. Most importantly, those members who still use the tuxedo because they have not been able to acquire the new uniform yet actively participate in the Fourth Degree. This policy change is not intended to make such members feel excluded. New members have the option to buy one for wear at black tie functions requiring a tuxedo, e.g. State or supreme conventions. However, the use of the social baldric with a tuxedo is not mandatory but a way for a member to show pride in their Fourth Degree membership.

4. Can districts or assemblies purchase social baldrics as gifts to new members?

Answer: Yes. Although, it would not seem to be a very practical financial decision considering how seldom they are used any more.

5. What is the dress code for the Patriotic Degree?

Answer: The preferred dress code is the new official uniform with beret. However, if the candidate does not have the new uniform, they may wear a dark suit and tie.

6. May new candidates wear tuxedos for the Patriotic Degree?

Answer: No – effective July 1, 2024, as it makes no sense to buy or rent a tuxedo for a degree. The expense of purchasing or renting could be used instead to offset the cost of a new uniform.

7. Can mixed honor guards occur where some members still wear their tuxedo and social baldric, and others wear the new uniform?

Answer: No, as it does not lend to uniformity. Honor guards are limited to the new uniform.

8. What is the District Master's Fund and how does this change impact it?

Answer: District Masters are not reimbursed by the Supreme Assembly except in very rare cases. As such, the Master must carefully plan travel to visit assemblies and to conduct degrees. Last year, the Board of Directors voted to increase the exemplification fee to \$90, meaning that a district may charge up to that amount. Masters often lose money carrying out their duties. Between travel and degrees, many use their own money to keep the Fourth Degree going. Simply put, this is not right! By increasing the fee and eliminating the social baldric for new candidates, it increases the Master's ability to conduct a meaningful degree, Mass, and banquet without going in debt. Essentially, it provides relief to dedicated Sir Knights who are giving significant time and leadership to the Fourth Degree.

9. What is the change with name badges?

Answer: Previously, no name badges were worn with the current uniform, and this creates a bit of confusion. Especially in social settings where nobody knows the names of attendees from other assemblies, etc. To remedy this, members may now wear a Fourth Degree name badge with the current uniform ONLY in a social setting and NEVER in an honor guard. Since the embroidered emblem on the left breast and wear of medals prevents wearing a badge on the left, the name badge may be worn on the right breast, using either a pin or magnetic backing.

10. May I wear any name badge?

Answer: No. It must be the Fourth Degree name badge for your assembly or one that designates your current rank, including past or former FN, FF, DM or VSM ranks. There is no requirement to purchase a specific name badge for wear and you may even add a magnetic backing to your current badge instead of incurring additional costs.

11. Are there any exceptions for wearing a Third Degree name badge?

Answer: Yes – current State Officers (including District Deputies) may wear the badge for their respective office. The same rule applies to current Supreme Officers and Directors. Past Supreme Knights, Immediate and Past State Deputies, Former State Chaplains, and Former Supreme Directors, may wear their respective badge indefinitely.

I hope that these answers provide a better understanding of the recent changes to policy.

Wearing name badges on the Uniform

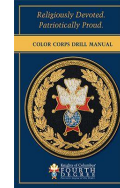
1. Any member may wear their assembly's Fourth Degree badge on the uniform.
2. It is worn on the right-hand side, level with the top of the left-hand pocket.
3. It is worn in social settings only. Never in an honor guard.
4. It should have a magnetic or pin backing since there is no pocket on the right breast.
5. There is no requirement for a specific style of badge nor a necessity to order a special badge from Knights Gear.
6. A member in Memphis asked the WSM if he could just add a magnetic backing to his current badge, and he said that would be fine.
7. The only exception to a Fourth Degree badge are badges of office for current state officers (including DDs) and a Past State Deputy.

Present Sword

1. This command is used to salute with the sword. It is used when the unit is presented to the colors, to any person, or when the National Anthem or To the Colors is played.
2. The preparatory command for this order is "Present."
3. At the command of execution, "Sword," raise and move the sword to the front, bringing the hilt of the sword to the center of the chin with the guard flange to the front.
4. As the sword is placed at the center of the chin, allow the flat side of the blade to extend on an angle away from the face of the holder, keeping all of the swords for all of the unit consistent and in a straight line, the thumb on the grip directly behind the guard and the remaining fingers grasping the grip firmly and the right elbow resting against the body. (See Figures 14, 15 and 16.)

Korean & Vietnam War Census Program

The Fourth Degree will conduct a census of the membership to establish a record of service in the Korean and Vietnam Wars.

Following the World Wars, the Order documented war service by its members in the archives at the Blessed Michael J. McGivney Pilgrimage Center however similar efforts were not conducted following either the Korean or Vietnam Wars.

The Korean War commenced in 1950, making the approximate minimum age of surviving veterans ninety-one years old. The approximate minimum age of surviving Vietnam veterans serving from 1965-1973 is 68-76 years old. Both the Korean and Vietnam Wars marked a significant departure in how troops served and returned from war, as service was no longer for the duration. Gone were the hero's welcome on return. Vietnam veterans returned to a hostile and divided nation, where they were either overlooked or criticized for their service.

For Assemblies working in conjunction with their assigned councils in conducting the census of their membership please use the most current form;

Where possible, documented service of deceased members needs to be recorded. Inclusion in the census shall be limited to veterans meeting the requirements established by Congress for the Korean Service Medal you must have served from June 25, 1950, to July 27, 1953, and was on permanent assignment or on temporary duty for 30 consecutive days or 60 non-consecutive days and performed his duty within the country of Korea. For the Vietnam Service Medals, you must of served from July 3 1965 to March 28 1973 and was on temporary duty for at least 30 consecutive days or 60 non-consecutive days or have served in combat with a unit directly supporting a military operation in Southeast Asia (Vietnam and the contiguous waters and airspace in Thailand, Laos, or Cambodia; or the airspace thereof and in the direct support of military operations in Vietnam.

Certificates recognizing service will be delivered to surviving veterans via their councils. District Masters, it is recommended that you reach out to all your Faithful Navigators to collaborate with their local Grand Knights to hold a party or dinner for those Veterans receiving the certificate. There should also be a 4th Degree Honor Guard present during the certificate presentation. Let us show our appreciation to those veterans in our council who served in these two wars and to let them know that their sacrifices are not forgotten.

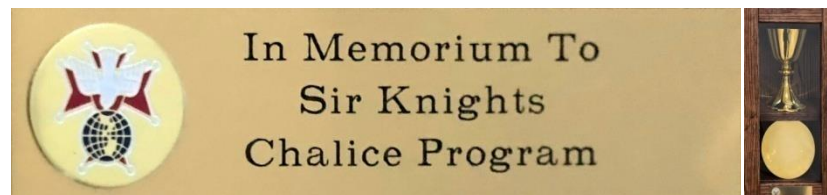

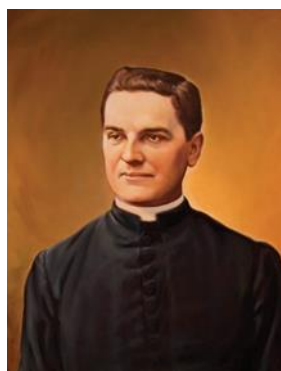
