

SEPTEMBER 2025 SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

"Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." (Gospel for Sept. 7, Lk 14:27)

Suffering is an inescapable part of human life, a consequence of the fall. When we deal with our suffering in a virtuous way, we unite ourselves to the cross of Christ. In fact, Jesus tells us that taking up our cross is an essential condition for being his disciple. The wonderful thing is that God will supply whatever grace and strength we need to carry our cross, if only we ask for it in faith. May we always carry our cross daily with courage as faithful followers of Christ.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, as we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross on Sept. 14, I challenge you to undertake some sacrifice or mortification — such as abstaining from meat one or two days a week — to strengthen your willingness to carry your cross daily.

Questions for Reflection:

What are the crosses you must carry in your life? Which do you struggle with the most? Do you faithfully and regularly seek strength from Christ in carrying your cross in prayer and the sacraments?



My Argument for Story-Tellers

I've been reading gun magazines since the early 70's, and I have gotten to know some of the writers pretty well through their writings; a couple of them I have had the privigilage of meeting in my years in law enforcement in southern New Mexico. Skeeter Skelton and Bill Jordan worked the southern border as Border Patrol Agents, Skeeters son, Brett, a New Mexico State Police Officer. All three are gone now, but their writings are still with us.

Others, Mike "Duke" Venturino and John Taffin have also left us to go home, but their writings and the story's they told are still with us to this day.

All of them of course, talked about guns. But, more importantly, and the main reason I kept reading them, is what they all had in common, they were all story-tellers; when they weren't writing about guns, and sometimes when they were, they told real life stories, about real life people, places, and times. They painted pictures in my mind that took me to those places, and through the art of their story-telling I felt I had met some of those people in history, some of them in the very same places in history that I would find myself working in over a hundred years later.

Now, I told you all of that because I want to talk about this:

All through history, humans have been story-tellers, some story's repeated over countless generations with amazing accuracy. Some of those stories, when they were finally written down, became the book of Genesis, the first book of the Bible, which is itself a story. It is a story of God, of His love for us, and of our need for Him.

We, as humans, have the unique ability to imagine, something that sets us apart from every other living thing on this planet, and the Bible plays on that ability. In prayer, when we read the Bible, when we read the scriptures with open hearts, we begin to imagine those people, places, and times in those stories, and so we begin to feel what they felt, as in the Psalms when the story-teller cries out to the Lord in fear that the Lord has abandoned him, and his pure joy when the Lord restores his faith, when he realizes the Lord has not left us.

In prayer, when we read the Gospels, when we read the Acts of the Apostles, when we read Paul's letters, and the rest of the New Testament, we find ourselves walking with Jesus and the Apostles, listening to Jesus and talking with others as we travel through those very real stories.


John puts us at the foot of the cross of Jesus with His mother, and her sister Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala, listening to His last words in His life as a man, as He prays to His Father in Psalms, as He so often did throughout His life; "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me", the first line in Psalm 22; and his words of forgiveness, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do". Then we begin to realize those words of prayer and forgiveness we heard as we walked with Him sets the course for our lives.

G.K. Chesterton wrote that our lives are a story, that has a beginning, a middle, and an end, and we are the story-tellers. As we witness what we have imagined as we walked through those very real stories of the Testaments, the Old and the New, we begin to better understand the power of prayer and forgiveness, the power of service to others, and our calling as Knights to make our stories ones of right order; that stuff is just stuff, and that what is real is what our hearts and minds continue to witness on our journey through the Bible; <u>and our understanding that in the end, that is all we will take with us</u>. What will our story be when we stand before Jesus?

As the story-tellers, our answers to that question will tell our own individual stories; but rest assured my brothers, those answers will tell the story of our lives.

In Step

Message From Fourth Degree Director of Training

This past week I had the honor to serve at the wake and funeral for a fallen brother and friend. Our Grand Knight took a video of a few of our postings and texted them to me. Although I think we did a fine job, there were a few things we really need to work on, and the first thing was keeping in step with your partner.

Our entrance was fine; the departure from the posting with our members who just did a shift is where we got lazy. When working in pairs, make sure you keep the same pace as your partner, start off the same (left foot), keep in line with your partner, stop at the same time, use your peripheral vision to slow down or speed up, work with your partner after each shift to work out anything you know can be improved.

This should be practiced as much as the proper carry and present sword at a call out. We want to be sure that we honor our brothers and their wives by being as professional as possible at a call out.

At your next Assembly meeting, please take 15 minutes to practice keeping in step with your partner, starting off on your left foot, nice pace at entrance and departure (this is not a race to the back of the room). Honing your skills as a member of the Color Corps is essential and appreciated.

Updated Drill Manual

The Drill Manual contains significant changes including certification of Color Corps Members in Marching and Manual of the Sword (Appendix A), as well as appearance standards (Appendix C).

Regalia Wear – the KofC Fourth Degree standard is "One Button" used on the jacket. See the Drill Manual for photographic examples. The Bottom Button of the jacket is not used.

Could the wear the Fourth Degree uniform blazer with other slacks and a regular tie when going out with this wife? The answer is: No

Our uniform was designed to be worn complete with the Fourth Degree blazer, official slacks, tie, and official Fourth Degree pin (PG-113). It also requires a white dress shirt with no button-down collar, black shoes, and black socks. However, it may be worn in social settings such as Knights of Columbus events, banquets, exemplifications, meetings, and church.

The other components of the uniform are used when participating in our color corps (color guard or honor guard). Those include the official beret with flash representing office (if any), white gloves, a service baldric, a Fourth Degree sword with scabbard. Flag bearers would not wear baldric or sword. (Note that the service baldric is either a general member baldric or else a specific color to indicate your current office held).

So, if you want to show your pride as a member of the Fourth Degree, then wear all the components according to the laws and rules of the Fourth Degree.






