



5 REASONS WHY YOU SHOULD PRAY THE ROSARY

October has many traditions. There's post-season baseball, tailgating at football games, apple picking and, of course, Halloween. But most importantly, there is the Rosary.

As **decreed** by Pope Leo XIII, October is the Month of the Rosary. For Knights of Columbus, this has a special significance. When a man joins our Order, he receives a Knights of Columbus rosary – at 1.9 million members, that's a lot of rosaries. And praying the rosary is an activity that our members do communally as part of council life.

According to Catholic traditions, St. Dominic was given the rosary by the Blessed Virgin Mary in 1214 in the Monastery of Prouille.

Since then, it has become one of the Catholic Church's powerful tools of prayer. But why pray the Rosary? Here are 5 of them. One for every decade.

1) The Blessed Mother gave us 15 Promises if we prayed the rosary

Alanus de Rupe, a 15th century Dominican preacher, claimed that he was visited by the Blessed Virgin Mary, who gave <u>15 promises</u> to Christians who prayed the rosary, including the Blessed Mother's special protection and greatest graces, the light of God, a powerful armor against Hell, as well as dominance over misfortune.

2) To obtain world peace

"Continue praying the rosary every day in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary, in order to obtain peace for the world and the end of the war, because only She can help you." This is what <u>Our Lady of Fatima said</u> to three children, Lucia dos Santos and her cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto in June 1917.

The Blessed Mother visited the children in Fatima, Portugal from May 13, 1917 to October 13, 1917 a period that culminated in the Miracle of the Sun, otherwise known as, "The Day the Sun Danced."

3) Time to reflect on the Gospel mysteries

The rosary consists of the Apostle's Creed, the Hail Mary, the Our Father, the Glory Be, along with other prayers. However, in between each decade, we are invited to reflect on the **Mysteries of the Gospel**: Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious, and Luminous.

In these mysteries, we rediscover, examine, and ponder the stories from the Gospel, and discover the real meaning of those events in the silence of our hearts.

4) Spiritual healing

And speaking of silence, another purpose of praying the rosary is to allow the repetition of the prayers enter into the silence of our hearts, where Christ's spirit dwells.

It is in that silence, we become more connected with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Not only that, but Jesus <u>reveals to us</u> that "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind."

But to do so, we must make time for Him. The rosary is the perfect way to make time to connect with God, and for spiritual healing. Take 15 minutes a day to be one with Him.

5) Prayer works!

The power of prayer is unspeakable. The answer to every prayer is a miracle, in and of itself. It is our lifeline to Him, to our souls, and to each other.

But the reason why October is the Month of the Holy Rosary is due to the power of prayer.

In 1571, Pope St. Pius V organized a group of Christian forces, known as the Holy League, in defense of an imminent invasion by the Ottoman Empire. Before a battle with the Ottoman fleet in the Gulf of Patras, in the Ionian Sea, the pope called on all of Europe to pray the rosary for victory. These prayers was answered, with the Holy League defeating the much larger Ottoman forces on October 7 at the battle of Lepanto.

To commemorate the victory, Pius V established the feast day of "Our Lady of Victory" – also known as Our Lady of the Rosary.

Hundreds of years after the battle of Lepanto, Pope Francis is now **calling** all Catholics this month to pray the rosary daily to "protect the Church from the devil, who always seeks to separate us from God and from each other."

So, in solidarity, let us pray to our most gracious advocate, the Blessed Mother, for peace throughout the world, and within our souls. It only takes 15 minutes.







OCTOBER 2023 SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

He said to them, "Whose image is this and whose inscription?" They replied, "Caesar's." At that he said to them, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs **to God.**" (Gospel for Oct. 22, Mt 22:20-21)

Above all things, we have a duty to do as Christ enjoined us and give "to God what belongs to God." However, Catholics also have a moral duty to be good citizens and take part in their communities. As good citizens, we must work peacefully to ensure our laws are just. Let us never approve or ignore injustice in our societies, especially when human life or dignity is at stake.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to make some specific effort to defend human life in your nation or your community — whether through charitable work, writing a letter, or praying outside an abortion facility. Second, I challenge you to participate in the Faith in Action Novena for Life program.

Questions for Reflection:

Have you become complacent about defending human life? Do you recognize the tragedy of legal abortion, but fail to do much about it? Do you remember in prayer those whose lives and dignity are compromised by unfortunate circumstances or the oppression of bad laws?

October 2023

I was watching, again, To Kill a Mockingbird, a few days back. I first saw this movie when the Nuns showed it in my Catholic school, back before the earth's crust cooled, or so it seems.

But for all the years I've been watching this movie, looking for one central theme, it finally came to me that this movie is full of themes, or lessons if you will. The one that struck me with this watching was the scene where Bob Eule spits in Atticus's face as he was coming out of the home of the black man he was defending in a rape trial. If you've watched the movie, you've seen that scene.

Atticus starts to reach and Eule backs, as if expecting some kind of retaliation. Instead, Atticus reaches for a handkerchief, wipes his face, turns back to his car where Scout and Jem are watching, and drives away.

In that moment I thought of St. Paul; I mean come on; how can you miss it? But with that thought comes the obvious question I ask myself all the time; Could I do that, or would I strike back?

For me, I guess it depends on where I am in my timeline. Not too many years ago, having been raised in today's world, and with my background where I was taught to react, not be intentionally violent, but to immediately remove the threat, I usually would not have simply walked away, in point of fact, it was a very rare event when I did walk away.

What changed? Time, position, age, St. Paul, Jesus. When I gave up the badge, I gave up the authority. But I found I didn't really miss it. In the years I wore the badge I came to learn to appreciate the maturity necessary to understand the responsibility that came with it. That lesson asked questions about a better way to do things, but more importantly, how to change my thought process, so my first reaction was not to strike back.

Fast forward from the mid-80s to 2000 and Pam. Meeting Pam opened the door for me to do what I had been wanting to do for so many long years, find my way back to the Church.

When that door opened, there was Jesus, there was St. Paul, there were all the martyrs and saints who understood better than I the message of Jesus and St. Paul of non-violent resistance, who joyfully gave their lives for that message; and there was the Church, patiently waiting for me to come home. Changing this thought process was a hard thing for me. Much prayer was involved!

Lord, make me an instrument of Your Peace: Where there is hatred, let me sow love: Where there is injury, pardon; Where there is doubt, faith; Where there is despair, hope; Where there is darkness, light; And where there is sadness, joy.

O Divine Master,
Grant that I may not
so much seek To be
consoled as to
console;
To be understood, as
to understand;
To be loved, as to
love;

For it is in giving that we receive, It is in pardoning that we are pardoned,

And it is in dying that we are born to Eternal Life. Amen "When you call me, when you go to pray to me, I will listen to you. When you look for me, you will find me. Yes, when you seek me with all our heart, you will find me with you, says the Lord." Jer 29:12-14

Jesus asks the apostles "Are you willing to do the hard things"? and they answered yes. What Jesus does next will be a test of that answer. Jesus sends the apostles out, 2 by 2, with nothing but the clothes on their backs and the power and authority to heal the sick, to raise the dead, and to start the evangelization of his ministry to the world.

And that is the question Jesus asks of us. Are we willing to do the hard things, are we willing to respond to attacks, not with violence, but with the evangelization of his word? Are we willing to forgive those who attack us as we stand to protect life, or who bear false witness against us before Caeser? Or, are we afraid to answer that question because of what He might ask of us next?

Are we willing to find a way to forgive those, who in their moment of personal misery, chose to take their lives away from those of us who love them so much?

Recently I have learned very personally that is the hardest question Jesus is asking of me now. Jesus says "Take up your cross and follow me". This is my cross.


In his letter to the Romans St. Paul writes: "If your enemy is hungry, feed him, if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by doing so you will heap burning coals upon his head. Do not be conquered by evil but conquer evil with good." This is a hard thing.

And there's the question again, this is what Jesus is asking:

Are we willing to do these hard things, whatever they are, whatever He asks?

And so my brothers - how will we answer?
