





OCTOBER 2025 SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

"But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.'" (Gospel for Oct. 26, Lk 18:13)

The parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector relates back to our August monthly challenge about humility. The Pharisee exalts himself before God, extolling his superiority and keeping of the law. Meanwhile, the tax collector prays with humility, seeking mercy for his sins. Our culture stresses the importance of "self-esteem," but we must also remember that all of us are sinners in need of God's mercy. We should never approach God in a spirit of pride, but always humbly on our knees — confident of his loving mercy.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, the month dedicated to the holy rosary, I challenge you to pray five decades of the rosary daily, asking God for humility and mercy.

Questions for Reflection:

Have there been times in your life when you pridefully compared yourself to others, like the Pharisee in this parable? Do you perform a regular and careful examination of conscience so as to remain humbly aware of your sinfulness? What other steps can you take to become more like the tax collector in this parable?

My Argument for the American War Fighter:

It is not lost on us that this is the anniversary of 9/11.

24 years ago, cowards flew airliners into the Twin Towers in New York, the Pentagon, and a field in Pennsylvania. In their warped, twisted belief in their otherwise peaceful religion, they were determined to bring down America.

December 7th, 1941, the Japanese attacked the United States Naval base at Pearl Harbor, hoping to bring down America, and keep us out of the Pacific allowing Japan free reign. What these two attacks have in common is this:

They triggered in us a uniquely American "in-your-face" resolve, the exact opposite of their desired outcomes. In both, they badly mis-read Americans.

The cowards on 9/11 weren't smart enough to know this, the Japanese high command didn't believe it. Interestingly the architect of Pearl Harbor, Admiral Yamamoto did understand this, but was ordered to proceed with the attack anyway. He is quoted as saying "I fear we have awakened a sleeping giant, and filled him with terrible resolve." He was right.

This terrible resolve is what motivates men and women to join the ranks of our military, our war fighters who stand on the walls of our society looking out, to protect us against all who would harm us. Many of them didn't witness 9/11, because they hadn't been born yet – and yet, here they are, following in the footsteps of so many veteran war fighters who stood on those walls before them.

This terrible resolve is what motivates men and women to join the ranks of law enforcement, fire fighters, and first responders, our war fighters, who stand on those same walls looking in to protect us against the evil violence that so many would bring to harm us. Many of them didn't witness 9/11, because they hadn't been born yet – and yet, here they are, following in the footsteps of so many veteran war fighters who stood on those walls before them.

This terrible resolve is why so many men and women serve in so many supporting roles all through our country, in hospitals, in factories, in fields as farmers, as railroad men and women, as truck drivers, in IT and communications, in Emergency Management, as Priests, Deacons, Rabi's, Imams, Preachers, and so many others that make our society run and provide for the safety and welfare of others; who believe that our rights come from God, and that the purpose of government is to protect those rights.

This resolve is born in part out of our belief in these words, first written some 250 years ago at the beginning of this uniquely American experiment:

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are empowered *by their Creator* with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are life, liberty, and pursuit of happiness."

To say "We've had enough, this far and no further" is purely American. As Americans, as God fearing men and women in all walks of life, we Americans, war fighters all, are filling with this terrible resolve that stands against Marxist socialism, against communism, against Satan in our society.

This terrible resolve is swelling up all across America, and is producing the exact opposite of evils desired outcome of bullied intimidation designed to silence our voices; Instead, it is bringing us closer to our God, to our faiths and religions, to our Church's; and to each other.

Once again, evil has mis-read us, once again evil is creating American War Fighters.


Post Script:

I finished this yesterday before I learned of the assination of Charlie Kirk. There is a lot that can be said right now, but let me just say this:

Charlie Kirks assassin didn't get the desired outcome of intimidation, the shutting down of free speech; In that moment, with that one bullet, Charlie Kirks assassin *did* succeed in creating hundreds of thousands, maybe millions, of new young American War Fighters who will take their rightful place on these walls.







Color Guard Competition

It is time to prepare your Color Guards for the second competition this fraternal year! We are pleased to announce the First International Fourth Degree Color Guard Competition.

This competition will take place during the worldwide Catholic Patriot Day on **Tuesday**, **November 11**, **2025.** The objective is to highlight the Fourth Degree Color Guard's purpose of encouraging active Catholic citizenship and fostering the spirit of patriotism in members and the community at large

Participation Requirements:

- District Masters are to either hold a competition among their Assemblies' Color Guards or select their District's best Assembly Color Guard Team.
- Each District must submit one video, **between three to five minutes in length**, showcasing its Color Guard Team's skills.

Judging Criteria:

The judges will evaluate each video based on the Color Guard's performance, specifically assessing:

- Proper wearing of the Fourth-Degree uniform
- Proper carrying and posting of the National Colors, Papal Flag, and State or Province Flag
- Timing
- Movements
- Commands, both verbal and silent
- Proper sword control

All judging will be conducted strictly according to the instructions outlined in the **Supreme Drill Manual**.

Submission Details:

- The videos must be submitted to the Office of the Supreme Master at suprememaster@kofc.org.
- If the video file exceeds size limits, please upload the video to YouTube or other similar type of social media platforms and email the link to the address above.
- The submission deadline is November 28, 2025.

We will select the top five Color Guards in the Order and recognize their District Masters. The winning District Masters will receive a prize which will be announced soon.




